What this chapter teaches.

Different fibre types — natural fibres like cotton, wool, and silk, and synthetic fibres like polyester and nylon; the production process for cotton cloth — harvesting cotton bolls, spinning them into thread, weaving or knitting the thread into fabric, then dyeing and sewing it into garments; why people in different regions wear different clothes, based on climate and culture; and reusing and recycling old clothes.

Activity 1 — From Fibre to Fabric.

Children trace the steps from raw cotton to a finished shirt, in the correct order: harvesting → spinning → weaving → dyeing → sewing.

Activity 2 — Natural or Synthetic?

Children sort fabric samples or clothing labels into natural fibres (cotton, wool, silk) and synthetic fibres (polyester, nylon).

Activity 3 — Reuse Old Clothes.

Children think of creative ways to reuse or recycle old clothes instead of throwing them away.

Why This Chapter Matters

Understanding how clothes are made builds appreciation for the effort behind everyday garments and encourages sustainable habits like reusing fabric.
