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The Scientific Method

The scientific method is a systematic process used to explore observations, answer questions, and solve problems. It typically proceeds through: **observation** → identifying patterns through measurement → forming a **hypothesis** (an educated guess based on limited evidence) → testing it through experiments → building a **model** or theory that explains the pattern.

Observation and Hypothesis

Observation is gathering information directly through the senses or with instruments, to record how natural phenomena behave. A **hypothesis** is a proposed explanation, made on the basis of limited evidence, that can be tested further through experiments.

Scientific Models

A **scientific model** is a simplified representation of a real-world system, used to understand complex phenomena that may be too large, too small, or too complex to observe directly — such as models of the atom or the solar system.

Laws, Theories, and Principles

A **law** describes a regular pattern observed in nature, often expressed as a mathematical relationship (e.g. Newton's laws of motion). A **theory** is a well-substantiated explanation of some aspect of the natural world, built up from extensively tested hypotheses. A **principle** is a fundamental rule or basis on which other ideas or explanations are built.

Scientific Language, Units, and Estimation

Science relies on precise language and mathematics to avoid ambiguity. Measurements use standard **SI units** so that results can be compared and reproduced anywhere in the world. **Estimation** — making a reasonable approximate judgement without precise measurement — is a valuable skill in scientific reasoning, useful for sanity-checking results and forming predictions.
